



Car Free Activities in the Area

Here are some ideas of things to do nearby that can either be accessed on foot or by public transport so please consider leaving the car behind and 'Have a Car Free Day'.

In and around Broadway on foot:

- Take a walk along one of the many nearby footpaths (including the Cotswold Way National Trail) and enjoy the beautiful surrounding countryside. Many wonderful Cotswold villages can be reached on foot (see below).
- Apart from the wide range of shops, art galleries, restaurants, pubs and tea shops, the **Gordon Trust Museum**, Russell Square in the village is worth a visit. Located next to the Tourist Information Centre in the original Grade II listed workshop, the Museum celebrates the work of the renowned 20th century cabinet furniture maker, Sir Gordon Russell MC. The Museum is open daily and there is an admission charge.
- '**An Invitation to Broadway**' Broadway Tourist Information Centre produces a guided walk around the village along the High Street. The Guide costs 40p and contains information and the history of some of the wonderful buildings that line Broadway High Street.
- **Broadway Activity Park** is a must for children and teenagers. Situated off the High Street next to Broadway Fire Station.
- **Broadway Gravel Pit Nature Reserve** a 20 mins walk away on the Childswickham Road.
- Visit the 12th century church, **St Eadburgha's** on the Snowhill Road a 10 min walk away and visit the lychgate at the graveyard further along the road with its inscription to Francis D Millet who died on RMS Titanic in 1912.
- **Broadway Tower** (with its William Morris exhibition and fantastic views across 13 counties on a clear day) is about a 45 minute walk away on the top of the Cotswold escarpment. Near the Tower, the Rookery Barn Restaurant serves teas, coffees, snacks and lunches.
- **Snowhill Manor, Snowhill village and Snowhill Arms** all about an hour's walk away. Visit the National Trust property an Arts and Crafts Cotswold manor set in hillside gardens housing Charles Wade's collection of 'colour, craftsmanship and design'. Wander around the pretty village of Snowhill where Bridget Jones's Diary was filmed and have lunch (or supper) in the Snowhill Arms.
- Walk to **Laverton, Buckland and Stanton** (Mount Inn pub and Jill Carenza Riding Stables) or even further on to Stanway and see the tallest fountain in Britain at **Stanway House**, a Jacobean mansion. Allow 1.5 – 2 hours to reach Stanway.
- Walk to the lovely Cotswold town of **Chipping Campden (visit Dover's Hill (NT))**– home of Robert Dover's Olimpick Games which are held annually in May). Allow 2 hours to walk to Chipping Campden along the Cotswold Way. Perhaps stop for a bite to eat and get the bus back?

By bus:

- Although infrequent, buses serve Moreton-in-Marsh (Tuesday is Market Day), Bourton-on-the-Water, Stow-on-the-Wold (for Bourton and Stow change at Moreton), Stratford-upon-Avon (visit Shakespeare's Houses), Evesham (through to Worcester and with a change to Malvern), Winchcombe and Cheltenham. Our nearest bus stops are in the village. For timetables please see the leaflets in the Laundry Room or see us.
- Take the Cheltenham bus to Toddington and take a train ride into Cheltenham (or Winchcombe) on the Gloucestershire and Warwickshire Steam Railway. Visit the bustling town of Cheltenham Spa (there is a bus from the station into the centre from the nearby car park) or visit the quieter village of Winchcombe and Sudeley Castle.
